You are cordially invited to our 2nd Dresden Symposium to discuss:

Britain and Germany: 20 Years after the Delors Report on EMU, 20 Years after German Unification. What is the Outlook for the Next 20 Years?"

The build-up to European economic and monetary union (EMU) after the fall of the Berlin wall was an event triggered by the shifting patterns of global power politics. Rising dissatisfaction with the East German regime, seen in multiple demonstrations in Dresden and Leipzig, provided the catalyst together with the reform programmes of Mikhail Gorbachev for the reunification of Germany in October 1990. To mark the anniversary of German unity, as well as the Delors Report on the EMU 20 years ago, and to look forward to the challenges and opportunities of the next 20 years, this joint symposium of the German-British Forum and the British Chamber of Commerce in Germany examines the common tasks faced by Britain and Germany in the bid for a brighter political and economic future.

The British and German foreign ministers of the time, Lord Douglas Hurd and Hans-Dietrich Genscher, investigate the interweaving strands of foreign, security, economic and monetary policy.

This symposium will recognise the common nature of the problems faced by the two countries. We will look at key issues: domestic politics in the two countries, foreign policy, economics and monetary issues. The conference focuses on the premise that – despite differences in approach on many issues such as EMU – Britain and Germany can best face up to their difficulties by acting together as two of the key players in the European Union.

2010 is not simply a year of anniversaries; it is a landmark period for both countries as they seek a sustainable route out of the severe economic downturn of 2009. The gathering will concentrate on proposals for strengthening political and economic cohesion at a national and international level - not just for the year ahead but for coming decades.

During the dinner, the British-German Commemorative Medal for Bilateral Relations will be bestowed upon Hans-Dietrich Genscher, in his capacity a former Minister of Foreign Affairs and Vice Chancellor of the Federal Republic of Germany and an architect of German and European unity.

BCCG Organisation

BCCG is a privately-funded non-profit making membership network organisation, which was founded in Cologne in 1919 and in Hamburg in 1921. It had been closed down in the early 1930s and was re-established in Cologne/Bonn in 1960. HM Ambassador to Germany is honorary patron of the chamber.

Members of the chamber comprise 1,100 professionals and companies, of which approx. 10 % enjoy the special status „Sustaining Membership“. In addition to that, a number of members (up to the age of 40) have joined our Young BCCG programme. The network consists of over 3,500 personal addressees and we also maintain contact with our members in all European British Chambers through our membership in the COBCOE, the Chamber's umbrella organisation. The BCCG is the largest British Chamber in Europe.
